

EGG LANDING CRAFT COMPETITION

At the Fire Dept. on Main Street in Watertown

On April 26,2014 @ 1:00 pm

The goal of this project is to build a craft of any shape, no larger than 7"x 7"x 7". Your Egg Landing Craft (ELC) will be dropped with a raw egg in it from the top of a ladder to the floor. We want to see if your egg can survive the crash.

This is a project to be completed by the Cub Scout. Parental involvement should be limited to advice if the ELC is exceeding specifications. Have FUN!!!

Specifications

Your ELC must hold one large raw egg. You provide the egg.

Your ELC can not exceed 7"x 7"x 7".

Your ELC needs to survive a crash landing from 11 feet up to 75 feet.

Your ELC can be made out of almost anything.

If your ELC will mark or harm your mom's floor, it will not be allowed.

No sharp, hard corners please (Metal boxes, metal reinforcements, etc.)

Think soft and padded.

Put your name and den number on your ELC. Decorate as you wish.

Egg has to be inspected after each landing - provide a means of access.

Please Don't use Peanut Butter or any Peanut Products.

Material Suggestions:

Egg cartons, shoe boxes, soda cans or plastic bottles, cardboard tubes, milk cartons, newspapers, feathers, paper bags, Styrofoam, sponges, bubble packing, plastic bags, cardboard, popcorn, clay, rice, cereal, foam.

Remember think soft and shock absorbing.

Winners will be judged on:

Whether or not your egg survives.

How little your ELC is damaged in the crash landings.

Winner must prove egg is raw by smashing the egg in his hands with his parent.
